

# President's Message

Hello Colleagues,

I sincerely hope you have been able to recharge over the February break. I have enjoyed days with longer amounts of daylight and the mild winter. There are a few things in this update that I want to focus on: My recently concluded building visits with Ms. Swann, Governor Hochul's proposed budget for the 2023/2024 school year and some changes coming to NYSUT.

#### **Building Visits**

As I stated at the beginning of the year, one of my goals was to get out in the buildings more this year. After I concluded my first round of visits in the fall, I approached Ms. Swann and asked her if she wanted to join me for my second round of visits. She agreed, and meetings were scheduled between January 18th and February 10<sup>th</sup>. I want to thank everyone for their input. It was thoughtful, outlined positives as well as areas of need, and certainly provided some areas of focus for the district as budgets are developed and plans made. Ms. Swann and

I met on Friday February 17 for a debrief session. As we talked about the meetings, it was clear that we shared many of the same takeaways. Look for a correspondence from her in the near future outlining action plans. My conversation also reenforced my belief that the district and the members of the STA have many shared interests including wanting to work in a positive, safe environment which fosters an atmosphere of teaching and learning where all people are valued. We will need to work together to overcome some of the challenges presented during the building visits, but I am hopeful that these conversations have helped give the district an understanding of the STA membership perspective.

## Governor's Proposed Pudget

On February 1st, Governor Hochul released her \$227 Billion budget proposal which increased education funding to a record \$34.4 billion.

NYSUT President Andy Palotta had this to say about the proposed budget:

"For years, NYSUT members have been fighting for proper school funding and staff levels. The governor's proposed budget is a historic step in the right direction that promises to dramatically improve our schools and the communities they serve."

According to preliminary State Aide runs, Spencerport is in line to receive a 14.18% increase in state aide for the 2023-2024 school year. Should the governor's proposal be adopted, it truly is a historic step by fully funding Foundation Aide.

## Changes Coming to NYSUT

There will be changes in the leadership of our statewide union. Last fall, Executive VP Jolene DiBrango announced that she will be retiring from her position at the Representative Assembly (RA) held in April. Recently, President Andrew Palotta also announced his retirement. At the Representative Assembly meeting in late April, NYSUT delegates will be electing a new slate of officers. Updates will follow.
